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Course Content

Week 1 and 2 – Introduction to Horticulture

Participants are introduced to the industry and requirements including occupational health and safety, environmental work practices and identifying plants. Participants will start building a plant file and will continue throughout the program.

- Follow OH&S procedures
- Observe environmental work practices
- Work effectively in the industry
- Participate in workplace communications
- Recognise plants

Week 3 – Machinery and equipment

Participants are trained in the various machines and equipment including carrying out preoperational checks, calibrating equipment, reporting faults and maintaining operational records. In addition training will include basic servicing and repairs on a range of machinery according to scheduled maintenance programs. Participants will also learn how to operate a forklift.

- Operate machinery and equipment
- Undertake operational maintenance of machinery
- Operate a forklift

Week 4 - 8 – Landscaping project

Participants will work on a landscaping project from start to finish. The project will include surveying the area, interpreting site plans, installing materials including irrigation and plants. Participants will also have the opportunity to learn how to maintain gardens utilising sustainable principles and practices.

- Assist with landscape construction
- Determine basic properties of soil/growing media
- Apply chemicals under supervision
- Install aggregate paths
- Prune shrubs and small tree's
- Maintain properties and structures
- Plant trees and shrubs
- Install a micro-irrigation system
